

Do's (Mandatory Requirements)

1. Students shall maintain honesty and truthfulness at all times.
2. Students must attend school regularly and punctually.
3. Students must enter classrooms at least 15 minutes before the scheduled start of classes. The school gate will be closed 5 minutes before the first period.
4. Attendance and departure must be ensured through biometric fingerprint punching.
5. Students must show mutual respect and greet others according to accepted cultural and religious norms (e.g., Salam, Adab, Good Morning).
6. Students must be present in the classroom immediately after the warning bell rings.
7. Students are required to keep their school ID card visibly worn around the neck at all times and use the digital ID card for tracking attendance through punch verification.
8. Wearing the school uniform in the approved colour, size, and design is compulsory. Violation may result in a fine.
9. Students must wear the house shoulder badge as assigned.
10. Students must bring all required textbooks and notebooks according to the daily class routine.
11. After classes, students must clean the classroom, turn off lights and fans and leave classrooms quietly.
12. Students must use washrooms designated for their gender.
13. The cleanliness of the classroom must be maintained at all times. All waste materials, including garbage, unused paper, and discarded pencil remnants, must be disposed of appropriately.
14. Only institution-approved notebooks must be used.
15. Students who use bicycles must park and lock them properly in the designated bicycle garage.
16. Tuition fees must be paid between the 1st and 25th of each month either at the school bank booth or through approved digital payment platforms (e.g., T-Cash, Rocket) using the student ID number.
17. Students must participate in co-curricular activities in a disciplined manner, refrain from any actions that may disrupt discipline.
18. Participation in at least one sports or extracurricular activity is compulsory. Daily physical activity is encouraged.
19. Residential students must strictly follow hostel rules. Instructions will be issued by the Hostel Superintendent.
20. Students must respect others' personal space and private messages.
21. Students must report any suspicious, harmful, or uncomfortable online activity to parents or teachers immediately.
22. Students must comply with all instructions, notices, and guidelines issued by the institution from time to time.


